In 2024, the City launched numerous projects to protect its waterways and bolster its resilience to the impacts of climate change.

The goal of stabilizing the riparian buffers in Duclos Park and developing the waterways crossing the Patriotes District is not only to preserve our water quality, but also to promote biodiversity and bring our community closer to nature. 

PROPERTY ASSESSMENT ROLL 2025–2026–2027

Record average increase in assessed value of 52.7% for the Ville d'Otterburn Park's housing stock Otterburn Park, October 8, 2024

On January 1, 2025, a new assessment roll will come into force for the 2025-2026-2027 period. As everywhere in Quebec, the value of the Ville d'Otterburn Park's housing stock has increased at an unprecedented rate. Indeed, it now reaches just over \$1.92 billion, which represents a record increase of 52.7% on the value of all taxable buildings.

Note: As provided for in the Act respecting municipal taxation, the values shown reflect market conditions on July 1, 2023, and the variation in municipal valuation represents the market evolution between July 1, 2020, and July 1, 2023. This new roll will be in force from January 1, 2025, to December 31, 2027.

What impact will it have on my tax bill?

Although the property assessment is used to calculate municipal taxes, a higher property value does not necessarily mean a higher tax bill. It is the tax rate, set by the municipal council when the December budget is adopted, that will determine the final impact on residents' tax bills. However, tax rates will be adjusted to compensate for most of the increase in property prices in order to minimize the impact on taxpayers' wallets.

What is a property assessment roll?

The assessment roll is filed every three years by an independent chartered appraiser in accordance with the Act respecting municipal taxation. The roll inventories all properties located in Otterburn Park. It identifies each of the buildings and their owner and describes their use, characteristics and value. Municipal and school taxes are based on that value in order to distribute the tax burden equitably among property owners.

However, it is the tax rate set when the budget is adopted by the municipal council that determines the variation in the next tax bill. The value of the buildings entered in this new roll comes from the analysis of real property transactions carried out during fiscal 2023.

The future roll 2025–2026–2027 is now available online under the heading Rôle d'évaluation et taxes municipales (assessment roll and municipal taxes) – Ville d'Otterburn Park (opark.ca).

The information will also be available on the next municipal tax bill that will be issued in January. Property owners can file a request for a review of their property assessment before May 1, 2025.

STORAGE OF RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

A maximum of 2 recreational vehicles up to 10 metres in length may be stored or parked per property at a minimum distance of 1 metre from the side and rear property lines of the lot and 3 metres from a curb or sidewalk. Between November 1 and March 31 of the following year, the storage of any recreational vehicle or similar equipment is only permitted in the side or rear yard. Between April 1 and October 31 of the same year, only one recreational vehicle or similar equipment may be parked in the parking lot of the property, in the secondary front or front yard. Parking of a second recreational vehicle or similar equipment is permitted in the side yard or rear yard.

CAR SHELTER

Starting November 1, residents are permitted to install their car shelters (structure and canvas) and snow fences.

REMINDER

Only one shelter is permitted per property. The shelter must be erected in the parking space or driveway and must not exceed a height of 4 metres and an area of 50 square metres. A distance of 0.5 metres from the side property line is also required. To ensure everyone's safety, shelters must be located outside the triangle of visibility, 2 metres from the sidewalk or concrete strip. In the absence of these, there must be a minimum distance of 3 metres from the shoulder.

SNOW FENCES

Snow fences may be installed from November 1 to April 15 of the following year and must be located within the property lines and 2 metres from a fire hydrant.

WINTER CAMPAIGN

This winter, THANK YOU for helping our snow removal companies make our streets safe! Place your bin at the curb only on the morning of the pick-up and make sure that it is on your driveway and not in the street.

Shovel snow from your driveway onto your property instead of pushing it down the street, in the ditch, or on sidewalks. Clear the fire hydrant near your property.

Comply with the ban on parking your vehicle on the streets at night, between 2 a.m. and 7 a.m., until March 31. Snow removal equipment is an imposing size and snow is thrown far. You must be careful when they go by on the street and stay away from them, especially if you are on foot. To be effective, the equipment must travel between 30 and 40 km/h. Please be patient if you are following them!

A dozen spaces are available at the parking lot located on Des Groseillers Street (between Comtois Street and Des Œillets Street).

NIGHT PARKING

From December 1 to March 31, between 2 a.m. and 7 a.m. It is forbidden to park on the street. This allows us to clear snow better after a snowfall!



The district of Otterburn Park formerly known as Les Quatre-Terres is now called Le Patriote. This name recalls the events of 1837–1838 that took place in our region and also in Saint-Eustache. The Municipal Council of the Ville d'Otterburn Park has responded to the proposal of the Urban Planning Advisory Committee to highlight patriotic women who have not been represented in Quebec's toponymic landscape until now, as well as a young patriot from the region.

A little reminder. The Battle of Saint-Denis took place on November 23, 1837, in Saint-Denis, a village on the east bank of the Richelieu River. It was the only victory of the Patriotes during the rebellions of 1837–1838. It was followed by their defeats at the battles of Saint-Charles (November 25) and Saint-Eustache (December 14). Subsequently, many Patriotes took refuge in the United States where they organized around Dr. Robert Nelson.

The names below are part of the district located between the Régie intermunicipale de l'Eau de la Vallée-du-Richelieu on Chemin des Patriotes, and Ruth and Piller streets, and represent only the first phase of the project. The following information was taken from the website of the Commission de toponymie du Québec.

Dormicour Boulevard

In memory of sisters Marie-Thérèse (1788-1858) and Marie-Louise Dormicour (1784-1842). After the battle at Saint-Denis-sur-Richelieu, they helped Dr. Wolfred Nelson, then leader of the Saint-Denis Patriotes, to care for the wounded, whether they were Patriotes or British soldiers.

Louis-Lévesque Avenue

In memory of Louis Lévesque (1819-1837). Lévesque, a Patriote from Beloeil, was killed at the battle of Saint-Charles.

Angélique-Gazaille Street

In memory of Angélique Gazaille, née Hodgins (1790-1867). The widow of hatter Antoine Gazaille, dit St-Germain, she allowed the Patriotes to fortify her hat shop in Saint-Denis to face the British army during the battle.

Marie-Victoire-Dumouchel Street


In memory of Marie-Victoire Dumouchel, née Félix (1783-1853), married to Jean-Baptiste Dumouchel in 1809. She is said to have participated in the design and manufacture of the flag of the Patriotes of Deux-Montagnes, used during the Battle of Saint-Eustache. This flag, known as the "Saint-Eustache" flag, depicts a maple branch topped by a muskellunge decorated with fir cones on a white background, on which appear the letters C, for Canada, and JB, for Jean-Baptiste.




